KS: Hey, instead of phys115 and phys116, we can also enrol for phys117 or phys118 right?

M: Where can I find the art sci courses? I've tried checking the academic calendar on queen's website but nothing's there...

Alana Korczynski: PHYS 117 is no longer offered, it was split into PHYS 115/116. You can take PHYS 118, it is typically only offered online in the summer term

Alana Korczynski: You can search for all courses here, but note that all courses may not be offered every term/year; <https://queensu-ca-public.courseleaf.com/course-search/>

m: is there anyway to view the class structure/timetable for specific classes right now?

OC: When will we find out who our academic advisor is?

Alana Korczynski: You can search for classes in SOLUS now, however you won't be able to add to your shopping carts until July 17th.

KG: Since transfer credits are automatically assessed, will SOLUS allow us to add 2nd year courses like Chem and Bio to our cart by the time our enrolment appointment arrives? Or will this cause an error message?

Alana Korczynski: Your academic advisors will reach out to you in August, but please feel free to attend the drop in advising sessions during registration - it will be rotating advisors

AH.: Where can we access the drop-in sessions?

k3: if I want to transfer let's say AP chem, should I choose CHEM 112 as an elective? or I can choose something else?

Mide Olanrewaju (4th Year): Replying to "if I want to transfer..." If you feel you still need a foundation for chemistry then it doesn't hurt to take CHEM 112. However, if you feel good about your chemistry you can take other electives.

CS: When we register for courses during our enrolment appointment, will we be selecting time-slots and creating our timetable? Or are we just selecting courses?

AH.: What does it mean by blended on the course selection? For Chem 112, it shows lecture/lab...but for health science it shows Blended? What would happen during those in-person hours? Why is it labelled that way?

Alana Korczynski: 200 level courses typically require a student to be 2nd year standing (completion of 24 units), as you can only transfer 18 units you would still be considered level 1. You can re-take courses you receive a high school transfer credit for.

AS: If a course has a specific offering faculty, does that mean other faculties can not take it?

Alana Korczynski: There are multiple sections for many courses, so you will be choosing courses and specific times that work in your schedule

AH.: Is there a full list of all course offered at Queen's anywhere? Since on SOLUS, you need to search for each specific course

Alana Korczynski: As long as you meet the pre-requisite you can take courses outside of the Faculty of Health Sciences, however some courses may be reserved for students within their Faculty initially

Phoebe Ji (she/her) - Third year: There was a question in my breakout room: When do you register for summer 2024 courses?



OC: Do we need to choose the same section for biol 102/103? Or can they be different?

Andrew Dam (Fourth-Year BHSc): Replying to "Do we need to choose..." They are completely separate courses, so they can be different sections

Alana Korczynski: Correct, you can take different sections of BIOL 102 and BIOL 103 (or PHYS 115 and PHYS 116)

AH.: Are the courses listed on the Class Search and Enroll at the moment finalized? Or is there a chance they'll change by the time the shopping cart opens?

Mide Olanrewaju (4th Year): I also had a question from my room about the difference between Chem 112 and 113/114

Andrew Dam (Fourth-Year BHSc): Replying to "I also had a questio..." As far as I'm aware, the main differences are that CHEM 112 is an in-person course with a lab component, while CHEM 113/114 are online courses with no lab component.

AY: If I want to skip a course using my AP credits, do I have to register for that course on SOLUS?

JK: Is there anything we need to submit to SOLUS/Queen's before the start of the school year other than the course selection?

G: If you apply IB transfer credits for subjects like chemistry and math would that automatically meet those prerequisite courses for medical school programs?

Phoebe Ji (she/her) - Third year: Replying to "If you apply IB tran..." For some programs, yes! However, some programs also require a lab component to courses like chemistry or biology (which transfer credits would not include). Also, some programs do not accept transfer credits. Therefore, I would check in with the specific program to see the requirements

s: What is the difference between Math 121/126 and Math 123/124?

Phoebe Ji (she/her) - Third year: Replying to "What is the differen..." MATH 121 is the full year (6.0) version of calculus. MATH 123/124 are both half year courses that are essentially MATH 121 split up
